ELEMENTS AND CONCEPTS OF MUSIC*

RHYTHM	pulse (steady beat) grouping (groups of two or three pulses) pattern (pulses of differing paces and rests)
MELODY	pitch (low, middle, high) scale (a pitch or note ladder) interval (the space between two pitches)
FORM	motive (a rhythmic or melodic theme) phrase (a rhythmic or melodic "sentence") repeat (same) contrast (different)
EXPRESSION	pace (slow, medium, fast) dynamics (soft, medium, loud) articulate (accents, staccato, legato) interpret (style, culture, aesthetic, period)
TIMBRE	body (snap, clap, pat, stomp, etc.) voice (sing, speak, whisper, shout) percussion (woods, metals, drums, shakers) instruments (strings and winds)
TEXTURE	combinations (solo, duet, trio, quartet, etc.) harmony (differing pitches played or sung together) accompaniment (part that supports the main part)

LESSON DESIGN

Imitation: BrainDance: Eight fundamental movement patterns that wire the central nervous system and prime the brain for learning. Begin the class with this sequence to awaken the child's cognitive, social-emotional and motor systems.

Hear, See, Say & Do: Present the overall musical concept(s) and theme through these four learning modes at the beginning of the lesson to increase focus and retention.

Advent Prayer

-This piece can be introduced to the congregation the first week of Advent. Sing one new verse each week (change the verses as needed).

-Use as a processional at the beginning of the service or sing all four verses for Christmas Eve.

-Create a rhythmic ostinato for each verse and layer the percussion parts in as each verse is sung:

-	Verse Two:	"peace"	shakers	лллл

-	Verse Four:	"joy"	drum	

The Angel Rolled The Stone Away

-The children can create motions to accompany the words: roll arms on "rolled"; press hands out to the sides on "away"; show "bright and sunny day" above head and play the trumpet.

-Improvise with pitched and unpitched percussion instruments in F pentatonic.

-Develop a creative drama to go with the music for an Easter presentation.

Are You Lookin' For Jesus?

-Perform this piece for Easter as part of a dramatic presentation.

-Conga players are seated and hold the drums horizontally across the lap. Strike the center of the skin with the palm or butt of the hand for a deep, bass tone and slap the side of the drum on the rest:
